THE VERY REVEREND ALAN W. JONES served as the dean of Grace Cathedral in San Francisco from 1985 until January, 2009. Previously, he served as the Stephen F. Bayne Professor of Ascetical Theology at the General Theological Seminary in New York City from 1972–1982. During his tenure, he founded and was the first director of the Center for Christian Spirituality at General. Now a U.S. citizen, he was born in England and received his Ph.D. from the University of Nottingham. He is a prominent lecturer in Episcopalian and academic circles both nationally and internationally. He is also a prolific writer of books, articles, and editorial opinions. Jones was also the moderator of *The Forum* at Grace Cathedral.

He is married to Virginia (Cricket) Jones and he and his former wife have three children and five grandchildren.
